Agenda Item: Theft of helongings from girls' hostel

The meeting was called to order by the committee chairperson at 10.30am. The committee members present discussed the issue of theft of belongings from the girls' hostel. It was noted that several incidents of theft had been reported by female students living in the hostel.

After a detailed discussion, the following decisions were taken:

- The committee decided to set up a task force to investigate the thefts and identify the culprits. The task force will consist of members of the committee as well as hostel staff.
- The committee will also arrange for increased security measures in the hostel.
- The committee decided to organize a meeting with the female students living in the hostel to discuss the issue and to raise awareness about the importance of security and personal safety.
- The culprit student was evicted from the hostel after a discussion with her parents.
- Finally, the committee emphasized the importance of educating students about the consequences of theft and the need to respect the property of others.



The committee suggested that the institute should explore various options for providing e-content to students. These options could include:

- Providing access to e-content through the learning management system (LMS)
- Providing e-books or other digital resources to students

The committee also discussed the need to ensure that e-content is of high quality and is tailored to meet the needs of students.
